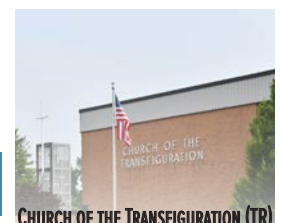

OLF Baptism Classes are held at St. Patrick Parish Center (white building behind the school), upstairs Room 3. **NEXT CLASS: JULY 13**

MATRIMONY: Schedule at least nine months in advance. Preparation program and parish registration is required.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Those weakened by age, afflicted by serious illness or preparing for serious surgery should receive this sacrament.

HOMEBOUND: Extraordinary Ministers can be arranged to visit homes and nursing facilities with the Eucharist for those unable to worship on Sundays.

SAFEPARISH: In order to serve as a volunteer with children within Our Lady of Fatima, you must be Archdiocesan-compliant and registered with the SafeParish program.

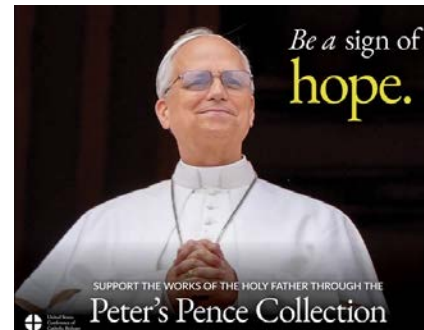

MASS INTENTIONS ARE NOW OPEN FOR THE NEW JULY 1 FISCAL YEAR!

We offer Masses for our deceased loved ones to aid them in their journeys to heaven. We pray with hope that the graces imparted by the Mass usher them further towards eternity with God. You may also have a Mass said for someone who is living which comes with additional graces. Stop into your church office to schedule a Mass for someone who has passed or to honor someone who is living. Intention Guidelines:

1. A maximum of ten (10) announced Mass Intentions per year from any one individual may be scheduled.
2. No more than (1) Intention per non-Purgatorian Mass. Purgatorian Masses (designated as "Purgatorian" Masses) may have up to (5) five Intentions noted in total reserved by the faithful.
3. Intention requests will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis with a \$5 gift per Intention (as defined by the AOC) payable at the church office.

Dear Parishioners,

The Mission Archdiocese of Imphal, comprising the entire state of Manipur in Northeast India is a home of 34 indigenous tribes, erected in 1980. Since the first Baptism in 1952, the Catholic population has grown to 101,238 with 52 parishes and 174 priests including 114 native priests. As part of our social commitment to the poor and needy, the diocese is launching a special grass-roots level Rural Community Health Workers Training Program in the tribal villages of Manipur State. This proposed 10-month program is designed to train village health workers who will serve some of the most vulnerable and remote communities where access to medical care and clean drinking water remains limited. Through this mission, trained health workers will help educate rural families about the prevention and treatment of diseases such as malaria, viral fever, tuberculosis, typhoid, pneumonia, polio and other waterborne illnesses. Along with health awareness programs, rural medical camps will also be organized with the help of Catholic Medical Hospital, Imphal to provide basic treatment and care to those who otherwise have little or no medical assistance. The program will especially focus on reducing infant mortality among newborn babies and improving the health of mothers and children. The trained workers will assist parish nurse sisters in administering triple vaccinations, offering prenatal support for pregnant women, and providing primary health care to the sick and elderly in the villages. The diocese is also committed to helping provide access to clean drinking water, an essential need for preventing many serious diseases and improving the quality of life in tribal communities. As part of this life-saving mission, the Archdiocese is undertaking this large-scale primary health care initiative with hope and compassion for the poor and suffering. We warmly invite you to participate in this noble humanitarian effort through your prayers and generous financial support. Your kindness can help bring healing, hope, and dignity to countless families in need.

A REFLECTION ON 42 YEARS OF DIOCESAN PRIESTHOOD

Full Circle: On June 3, 1984, I celebrated my first Mass at St. Patrick in Troy. As I retire on July 1, 2026, I will celebrate my final scheduled Our Lady of Fatima Family of Parishes (OLF) Mass at St. Patrick on June 30.

Where I Have Been: My first assignment was Associate Pastor at St. Raphael Church and teacher at Catholic Central High School, Springfield. My next assignment was Associate Pastor in Our Lady of Victory, Cincinnati, followed by Associate Pastor at Assumption Church, and teacher at La Salle High School, Cincinnati. I was assigned as Associate Pastor in St. Henry, Dayton. My first and only pastorate was at St. Michael, Ft. Loramie, and Ss. Peter & Paul, Newport. During this pastorate, I served as dean of the Sidney Deanery which is now a part of the St. Augustine Deanery. My final assignment is as parochial vicar of OLF.

Where I Am: As parochial vicar of OLF, I have had the blessing of working with Fr. Eric, our pastor, and Frs. Lee, Jim, Callan and Bachman as fellow parochial vicars and with all the wonderful staff and parishioners of our five parishes. While this is not how I planned to retire, like all my assignments, my four years at OLF has shown me how God is in charge, and I benefit greatly when I am open and willing to follow His Will.

Where I Am Going: As I retire on July 1, I have no “big” plans. I do plan to keep my residence at Lange Estate and eventually (after a couple of months of down time) be available to sub as needed in our St. Augustine Deanery. I hope to spend more time with my brother and sisters, nieces and nephews.

What I Have Learned: My identity is rooted in who I am before God rather than just what I do. My spiritual focus will now shift from active ministry to a life of prayer and presence. God’s grace and love are far greater than I understood in my earlier years of priestly service. So, my retirement will allow me more time for prayer, reflection and gratitude for God and for the people I encountered during my priestly ministry.

One of the most urgent repairs to St. Boniface is the: ROOF & EXTERIOR MAINTENANCE OF THE RECTORY & CHURCH

- Bell tower flashing repair (metal joints) to stop the leaks in the choir loft near the new organ and choir seating.
- Gutter, soffit, fascia replacement on church and rectory to eliminate leaking and to abate animal entry.
- Stucco replacement to fix what is delaminating from the brick. (Stucco protects soft-kiln bricks and mortar from the elements.) This was first applied in the mid-1800s with repairs along the way. There's anticipation of extensive damage if it's not professionally repaired soon.
